Director of Cricket Report

Josh Moxey

I was honored to have once again been voted in as the Director of Cricket of the Port Stephens Cricket Club Inc. in 2023/24.

Jumping into an executive role on the NDCA board was also going to put pressure on my ongoing position on our club board. The move to Secretary mid-year with Paul Marjoribanks' retirement, and Aaron Gray moving to Chairman put further stress on this. With the support of the entire committee, particularly Shawn Davies, we were able to make it through the year. While I understand you can't burn the candle from both ends, there are some important goals to achieve governance and administratively for our club that I am striving to oversee, and the NDCA executive are happy to allow me to continue in the role moving forward.

Season 2023/24 was yet another cricket season impacted by rain throughout various parts of the year. The board was able to strive towards several off-field goals in the early part of the year, which set us up for arguably our greatest seasons off the field in recent memory.

On the back of multiple purchases for the canteen and curators in 2022/23, we continued this drive - purchasing a new iPad for live scoring, a new refrigerator for the canteen, new covers, hessian and grow mats to arrive just in time for the wicket preparation to begin. We also got ourselves a second-hand ride-on mower which improved the look of our ground at times, with curators taking pride in how the grounds were presented more than ever. New shelving was installed in the back shed to assist in the storage of many new items, and we even got some quality Oberon soil to assist with wicket preparation.

Once again we stepped forward as a club with these purchases to set us up further for success into the future.

Staying off-field, we increased the number of club sponsors

significantly, with Eighteen33 coming on board as a Platinum Partner, the Spinning Wheel Hotel maintaining their place as a major sponsor, and numerous minor and match day sponsors coming on board.

On the field, it was just as successful. Kicking off with our Dennis Broad Cup side, we hosted two match days, and went through the group stage undefeated and headed to Number 1 Sports Ground to play a Semi Final against last years winners Waratah Mayfield. Thankfully we were able to go one better in 2023/24, knocking off the other Waratah Mayfield side in the final to be crowned the Denis Broad Cup champions, the first from the Suburban Districts competition.

Our club maintained its numbers from 2021/22 with our First XI falling away towards the end of the year after being undefeated into February. The boys would win the Minor Premiership, but would be knocked out in the Grand Final Qualifier by Merewether.

Our Second XI side had a successful year also. Some new faces came into the side and pushed deep into the finals, with a washout to Warners Bay stopping their season short in the Grand Final qualifier also.

Third XI however had a little more luck in the finals. Playing 6th Division and led by Jarryd Johnson, the side featured a few new faces who we hope enjoyed their time at the club. They would take on Beresfield Memorial in the Grand Final, with Jarryd Johnson being named Player of the Final and leading his side to victory to claim our first 6th Division Major Premiership.

We also entered the Masters Competition for the first time, which saw the return of some familiar faces, but also some new players come to the club in Brent Watson and Darren Thomson in particular. Rain thwarted our charge towards the finals, finishing in 5th spot after a

wash-out against Newcastle City at home in the final round.

We also hosted the Port Stephens Veterans Cricket Club throughout the year, bolstered by many Pythons players, our canteen girls, curators and all involved left a fantastic impression on the veterans association and all should be incredibly proud also.

We also held one of the cheapest Blasters Programs in the state, and definitely the longest in the region. Thank you to Ben Stanley for his efforts in assisting coaching this.

It was a fantastic year, which saw us fall agonisingly short of the club championship, however, we can take pride in getting so close despite being a smaller club!

A huge thank you must go out to the outgoing committee, who made the year as successful as it was. From fundraising weekly at our raffles, to running mid week canteens for Junior and Veterans Carnivals, a special thank you must go to Michelle Moxey, Dave and Lisa Freeman and Stuart Ellis. Thank you for all you done for us in 2023/24.

The biggest thank you must go to Shawn Davies, Brandon Wilson and Troy Elwes for their efforts with the curation in 2023/24. Stepping up after Craig Hunter's departure after more than a decade at the helm, the boys transitioned in quickly and was able to produce quality wickets, and more wickets than ever before!

Throughout 2023/24, we hosted six junior carnival matches, four mid-week masters matches, our regular season of Saturday fixtures, two Denis Broad Cup days, five veterans match days and most importantly, and incredibly for our little club, we hosted two T20 matches for the Australian Country Cricket Championships in

January, hosting the ACT, Victoria and South Australian women's sides. What a huge effort - thank you all for your efforts throughout the year!

We capped off our year with another great presentation night, with former Australian test player Nathan Bracken coming back to celebrate the season with us, interviewing Fletcher was probably the highlight this year round, but Saundo as MC had some moments with a hot-mic that may put his 2TM contract in jeopardy.

If 2023/24 was a big year, I can't wait for 2024/25

Financial Report

Please find enclosed the Financial Reports for Port Stephens Cricket Club Inc. 2023-24 Annual Report and AGM. In the last 12 months, the club received revenue of \$83,234.15 (up from \$75,043.37 in 2022/23 and \$59,084.58 from 2021/22) and incurred expenses of \$78,386.83 (up from \$74,428.74 in 2023/24 and \$59,084.58 from 2021-22) which led to a surplus of \$4,847.32, with \$1,700.00 still owed to the club.

Due to tighter ATO requirements, our auditors have requested that our yearly financial reporting run FY to FY, not AGM to AGM as previously reported. As such, some figures within the Annual Financial Report do include figures presented at last years AGM. Please see the breakdown which captures these two periods. One example of this is the Awards night which had significant payments between May and July in 2023, as well as costs incurred this year. The increase in revenue and expenditure can be directly related to a number of factors, ranging from increased registration costs, a full year of raffles, increased sponsorship and canteen takings. In an attempt to reduce our income and expenditure, the club did not report the weekly clearing house collection and payment of raffle expenses. This equates to approximate reduction of our reportable income and expenditure of \$16,100.00 for this year. The club outlaid \$4,523.63 for various pieces of equipment, had increased umpire and ball costs, as well as technology costs however we did not pay out any wicket-fees for 2023-24. With the proposed endorsement of our Not-for-profit status, the club may be eligible for significant reduction to many of those technology costs moving forward.

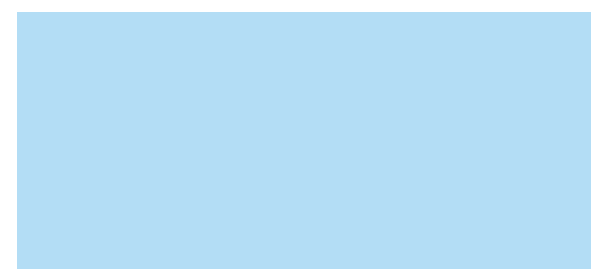
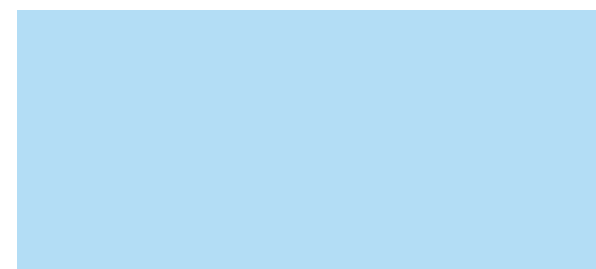

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

We have audited the financial report of the Port Stephens Cricket Club Incorporated ("PSCC"), which comprises the balance sheet as at 30 April 2024, the profit or loss statement for the year then ended, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the directors declaration

In our opinion, the financial report of PSCC provides a true and fair view of the Association's financial position as at 30 April 2024, and of its performance for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the ACNC Act 2012 and the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Directors for the Financial Report

The Port Stephens Cricket club has been one of the most successful cricket clubs on the field in Maitland Ond Day Cricket. There have been many success stories, Priemerships, finals appearances, Grand Final triumphs and even heart breaks.

The Port Stephens Shire Council Cricket Club (PSSCCC) entered into the Maitland Club Cricket competition in the 1986-87 season. A grade competition in the 1997-98 season and have since proven they are the team to beat, becoming a guaranteed feature of the Grand Final fixture each year missing only 3 in its 15 year history.

The club dropped the Shire Council association from their name in season 1998-99 when they adopted the Python as the club identity. This was accompanied with a Sky Blue coloured playing shirt, the first club to do so in Maitland Cricket history.

From that moment forward the success has continued to flow through all grades and this is testament to the level at which the Pythons continue to stamp as the benchmark of One Day cricket in the Maitland Region.

In 2021/22, the Port Stephens Cricket Club moved from the Maitland & District Cricket Association to the Newcastle District Cricket Association, winning the 1st Division Minor and Major Premiership in their first season.





A talented cricketer in his own right, starting way back in his junior days in Tasmania, through to the many clubs he crossed paths with on his journey. It is hard to put into words the impact he has had on cricket, but undisputedly his greatest impact was as a coach and mentor of young men and women, mostly within the RAAF and ADF sides.

Locally, he spent time at various clubs - Stockton & Northern Districts Cricket Club, Thornton Park District Cricket Club and Raymond Terrace District Cricket Club. However, his ties to the Pythons were bonded in his relationship with our RAAF cricketers, whom many he had played with or coached during his time involved in defence cricket.

Macey loved cricket - but he was a stand out gentlman too. He genuinely loved and cared for everyone he came into contact with and subsequently, they loved him too. But, there is no doubt he loved his family most.

After his funeral on 20 March, a small wake was held at King Park 5 for family members who had travelled from around the country to attend his RAAF funeral at Williamtown. At one point, essentially all of Ricky's immediate family were on King Park 5 playing a game of backyard cricket in what was a beautiful moment and fitting tribute to Ricky.

Historical Obituary

David "Yobbo" Robertson

18 Nov 1972 - 31 Oct 2003

David 'Yobbo' Robertson - A Phenomenal Opening batsman who was tragically taken from us, aged just 30, 15 years ago today.

Making his club debut in 2001, Yob had immediate success with the club and his impact is still being felt by those players at the club today. There are a few members of our club now that not only didn't know Yob, but also don't know of him at all. Those of you who did, please pass on the stories of this great bloke, and share a woodstock in his honour for round 4, forever known as the "Our Round 4 Yobbo"!

Yob held the record for the Highest Individual Score at the club of 175 for exactly 11 years. He scored this against Bowthorne on the 27th of October 2001 hitting 19 fours and 11 sixes along the way.

For those lucky enough to experience his unique approach to batting witnessed something no other player has matched at the club. A powerful hitter, he was always looking to score, with his trademark shot being the square drive, which he would regularly hit for six. He was the first player to score a century on King Park 5, scoring 127 against Fred Harvey in 2002. The same season, his powerful hitting would be on full display during the Grand Final, when chasing 75 to win against Hinton, he showed total disregard for the bowlers on his way to 54 not out of the 79 runs. An exceptional fielder behind the wicket, he had a safe pair of hands and would seem to throw down the stumps at will.

He is one of only 10 players for the Pythons to play Representative Cricket, and also represented the Pythons in the UK, playing for Westleigh.

Such was his impact on the club, the A Grade Players' Player award is known as the David "Yobbo" Robertson award, and his parents, Barry and Margaret, are our clubs only honorary life members, whom sadly are both know deceased.

Yob is part of the fabric that makes being a Python special, and he is proof that sometimes being a club great doesn't come merely from years of service, rather, being a quality teammate, friend, and club member for a few good years.

Club History

2005 C-Grade Grand Final

Now any sporting grand final is filled with emotion, whether that is sheer elation, gut wrenching nerves, bittersweet sorrow, or downright misery. But no one could have predicted the turn of events on the 20th of March in 2005.

A Grade was facing off against perennial rivals Tea Gardens at Robins Oval on a somewhat rain affected wicket. Further away on the outskirts of Tenambit, C grade were squaring off against Maitland City Bowls Sports and Recreation Club (MCBSRC) at Beryl Humble.

Both sides had been denied the opportunity to play it out the day before due to inclement weather, so Sunday matches were a must. A Grade batted first and with some solid contributions from Ben Longrigg (36), Brett Cox (26) Darren Morrison (29) and Michael White (22), even on a wet wicket the Pythons were able to tally up 136 in their 40 overs. There is more to the story of their innings but we will get back to that shortly.

Over at the C Grade game, the Pythons were also batting and going along reasonably well. The scorecard for this match is somewhere in the storage realm, but the only score that is readily available was 7 runs, scored by George Moxey before being run out.

This would ultimately be George's last score for the Pythons, and his last score in cricket. He was found not long after having suffered a heart attack and couldn't be revived.

News of George's passing filtered quickly to the A Grade boys, where his youngest son Josh was playing. Even after the news, Josh braved it and went out to bat, because that's what he believed his Dad would have wanted. Josh scored 1 run, but it was probably the hardest he would ever score.

A Grade went on to win the game convincingly restricting Tea Gardens to 91, Darren Morrison leading the way with 5 for 21 off 6.4 overs.

The match at Beryl Humble was abandoned, all players from both sides were visibly shaken and emotional. Talk was to declare that both sides be joint winners, but it was later determined that the match would be replayed the following week.

The story doesn't end there though. The C Grade boys were determined as ever to secure the premiership for the club and their fallen mate George, but they were also adamant that they would do it with only 10 batsmen. George Moxey was noted in the scorebook batting at 3 and retiring not out for 0. It certainly doesn't have the same ring as Phillip Hughes 63 not out forever, but to the 10 other Pythons on that field that day, it meant the absolute world to them.

The Pythons batted first scoring 8 for 102 off their 35 overs. Top scorer was Brad Bullman with 31, Warren Herbert added 16 opening the batting and Justin Doyle provided a handy 14 not out at the end of the innings.

On the field you'd be mistaken for thinking the Australian side turned up to substitute. Blokes were throwing themselves at everything and played with their hearts on their sleeves. Everyone chipped in, most bowlers taking 2 wickets, Shawn Davies taking 1 for 17 with the new ball and Justin Doyle effecting a run out to limit Maitland City to 96 runs.

The margin required for Maitland City boys to win when the last wicket fell was 7 runs.....The same amount of runs George had scored the week prior.

Also rain off in the near distance threatened for a solid 40 mins but held off until the last wicket was taken. This game ranks as one of clubs best dig deep matches and hopefully remains at the forefront of many memories amongst the club.
